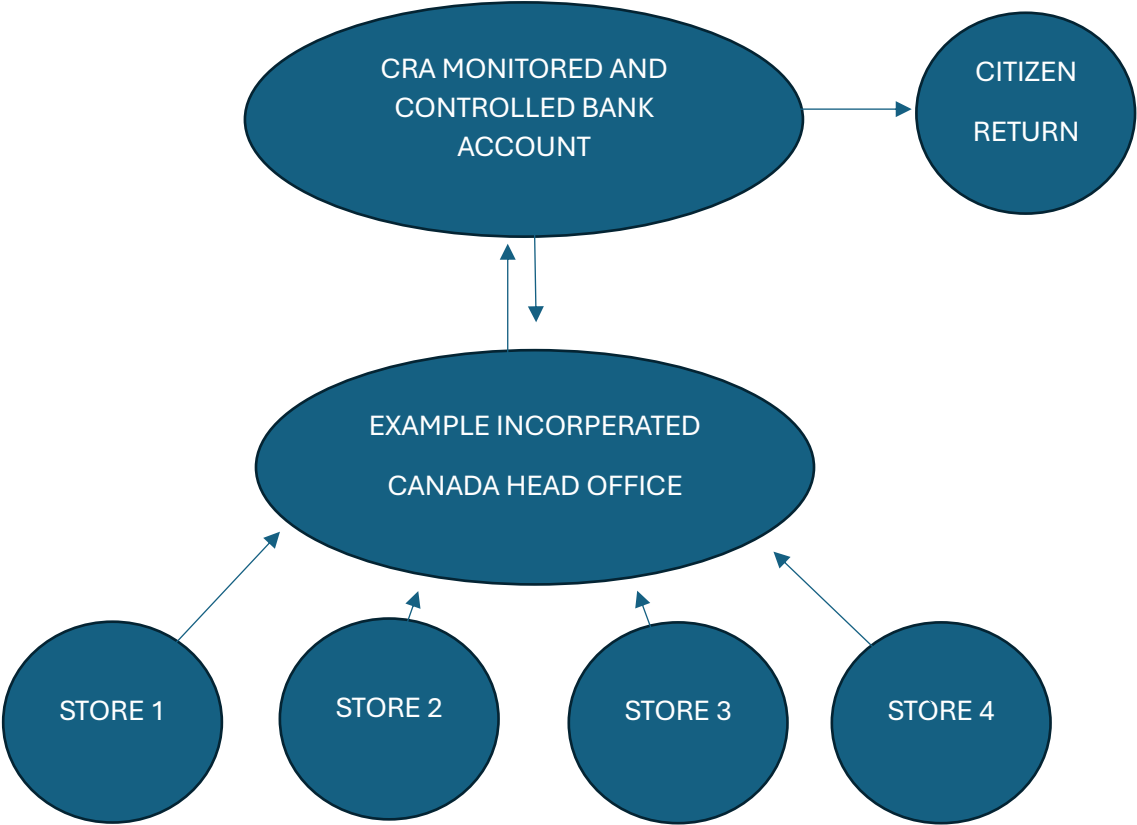

- 1 **Nationalization of Companies Threatening Exit:** Any corporation seeking to abandon Canada due to our policies will face consequences. Their assets will be nationalized, leadership replaced, and operations continued under new management. This ensures that essential functions of society remain intact, and workers retain their livelihoods.
- 2 **Strict Penalties for Corporate Misconduct:** Companies attempting to circumvent regulations will face severe repercussions. CEOs, board members, and officers involved in fraudulent activities will be held personally accountable, facing charges of defrauding the people and treason against the country.
- 3 **Overhaul of Banking System:** Banks will no longer operate as profit-driven entities at the expense of the people. Banks will transition to "Financial Service Centers," facilitating transactions without exploiting customers.

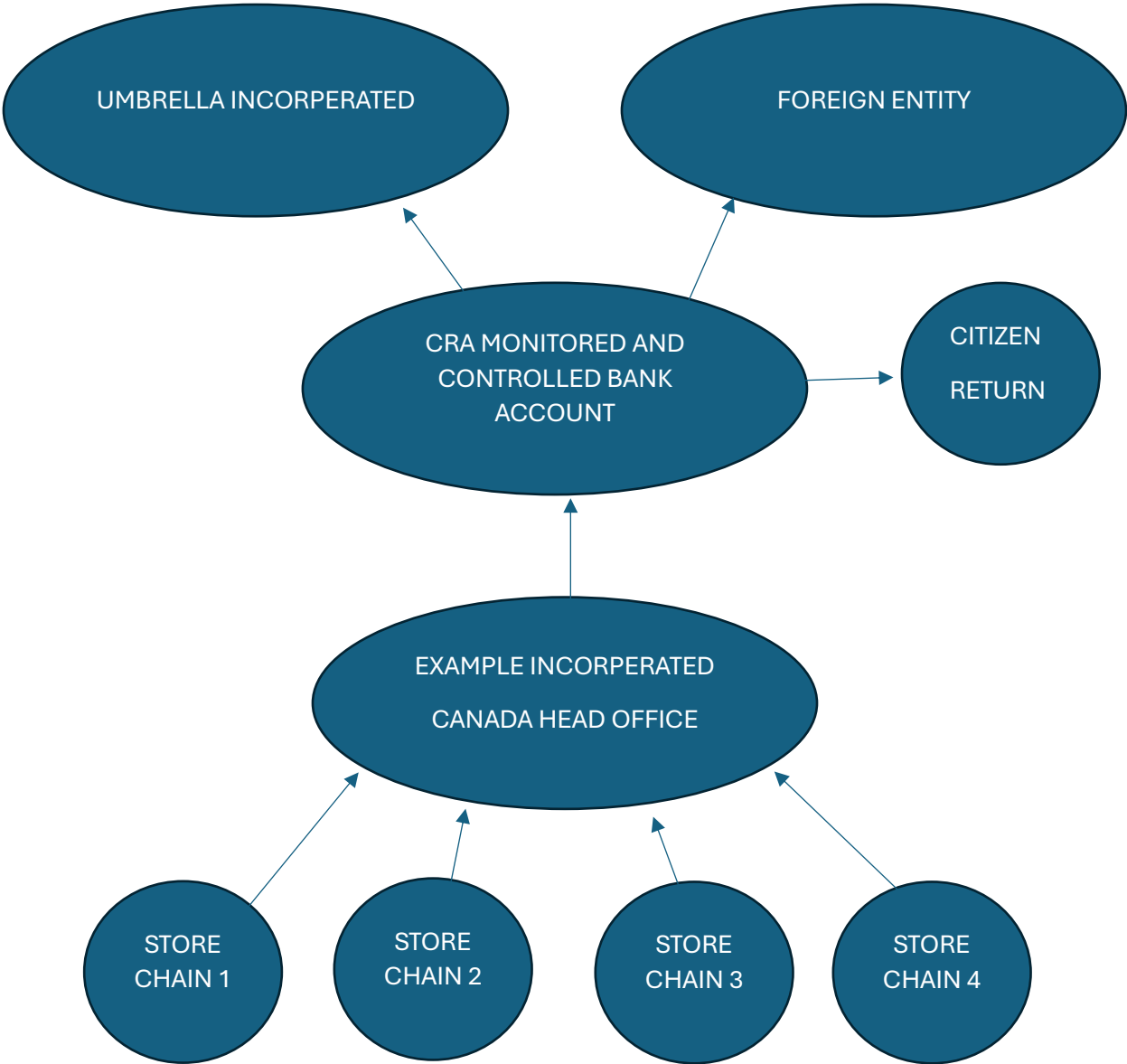
- 7 **Profit Cap for Business Entities, Churches, and Schools:** Every business entity, church, and school in the country will be permitted to earn a maximum annual profit of \$500 million. Should this threshold be reached ahead of schedule, the entity can opt to reduce the cost of goods or forward the surplus to the CRA for distribution to Canadian citizens through quarterly direct deposits.

- 8 **Regulation of Umbrella Corporations and Foreign Entities:** Umbrella corporations will be limited to 500 million in profit per year. This will be checked and monitored by the CRA. Daily total of Canadian dollars in umbrella corporation or foreign entities bank accounts will be capped at \$1,369,863.01. As Canada does not have a penny, the total will be rounded down to the nearest dollar. They will receive this money based on their employee’s payment schedule. For example, if their employees are paid every two weeks, then the umbrella corporation will receive their funds every two weeks.

Continuing the policies for a fairer and more equitable economic system:

- 9 **Limiting Business Deductions:** Business entities earning over \$1 million per year in profit will no longer be eligible for *any* business deductions. This measure prevents large corporations from exploiting tax loopholes and ensures a more equitable tax system.
- 10 **Elimination of Business Loss Write-Offs:** The ability to write off business losses will be removed. This encourages responsible financial management and prevents businesses from offsetting profits with excessive losses.
- 11 **Free Uniform Provision by Businesses:** Businesses will be required to provide uniforms to employees free of charge. This promotes workplace equality and removes financial burdens on workers.
- 12 **Abolition of "Years of Experience" Requirements:** Requirements for "years of experience" in job postings will be abolished. This fosters equal opportunity for all individuals seeking employment, regardless of their prior experience.
- 13 **Finality of Accidental Bank Deposits:** Accidental deposits into private citizens' bank accounts will be considered final. Recovery of mistakenly deposited funds will only occur at the discretion of the account holder, preventing undue financial burdens on individuals.
- 14 **Ceasing Tax Write-Offs for Churches:** Churches will no longer be eligible for tax write-offs. This ensures that religious institutions contribute their fair share to public services and fosters tax equity across all sectors.
- 15 **Ceasing Tax Write-Offs for Wealthy Donors:** Individuals with a net worth exceeding \$5 million will no longer receive tax write-offs for charitable donations. This eliminates a loophole used by the wealthy to minimize tax obligations and promotes a more progressive tax system.
- 16 **Discontinuation of Stock Market Loss Write-Offs:** Losses incurred in the stock market will no longer be eligible for tax write-offs. This discourages risky investment behavior and promotes responsible financial decision-making.
- 17 **Ban on Surge/Dynamic Pricing:** Surge or dynamic pricing practices will be deemed illegal. This prevents price gouging and ensures fair pricing for goods and services, particularly during times of high demand.

- 18 **Disclosure of Top Investors I:** Companies must prominently advertise their top three investors on store signs. This ensures transparency in business ownership and exposes control schemes to the public, empowering consumers to make informed choices.
- 19 **Disclosure of Top Investors II:** Similar to store signage, companies must display their top three investors on product packaging. This provides consumers with visibility into where their money is going and who controls the product, fostering consumer awareness.
- 20 **Elimination of Patent Charges:** Companies and corporations will no longer be permitted to charge for patents. Instead, they will simply have the legal right to produce patented products without facing exorbitant fees. This prevents exploitation by umbrella corporations and ensures fair access to innovation.
- 21 **Open Sourcing Patents:** Patents older than 20 years will be made open source to the public. This encourages innovation and prevents monopolization of ideas, allowing for broader access to technology and advancements.
- 22 **Privacy Protection for Cellphones:** Cellphones and Apps will be prohibited from listening to user conversations for advertising purposes. Protecting user privacy is paramount, and intrusive practices will be banned to safeguard personal information.
- 23 **End to Sale of User Data:** Companies will no longer be permitted to sell user data collected from internet browsing and apps. This protects consumer privacy and prevents exploitation of personal information for profit.
- 24 **Exposure to Corporate Misconduct:** Advertisements will be aired to educate the public about corporate espionage, deception tactics, and treasonous activities. This promotes accountability and exposes unethical business practices to the public eye.
- 25 **Ban on Fractional Denomination Charging:** Fractional denomination charging, such as pricing gas at 9/10th of a cent, will be deemed illegal. This eliminates deceptive pricing practices and ensures transparency in consumer transactions.
- 26 **Implementation of a Receipt Lottery:** Every transaction conducted through registered businesses will generate a unique receipt with an identification code. The Receipt Lottery verifies transaction legitimacy and detects fiscal malpractice. Citizens become stakeholders in curbing corruption and illegal financial practices in our country. The lottery winning amount will be determined at a later date, but likely will fluctuate and not likely to exceed 1 million dollars.

Money – Policies for Canada as a Whole

In pursuit of greater equality among the population, the following policies aim to streamline Canada's capitalist framework while promoting equality, fairness, and preparedness for the challenges of the future.

- 1 **Debt Forgiveness:** Canada will seek debt forgiveness from other countries, reciprocating with proportional forgiveness of their debts. National debts owed to banks will be written off. Banks serve the people; the government will only take loans from the National Bank.
- 2 **Ban on Race, Culture, and Heritage-Based Advantages and Disadvantages:** All race, culture, and heritage-based advantages and disadvantages will be banned and criminalized. This includes policies, programs, and laws that confer advantages or disadvantages based on these factors, ensuring equal opportunities for all Canadians.
- 3 **Phased Reduction of Race-Based Payments:** Monetary payments based on race, culture, or heritage will be gradually reduced by 25% over four years until they are completely ceased. This ensures a fair transition away from discriminatory practices.
- 4 **Generational Clause:** The government will not be held financially liable for past events beyond the average lifespan of a Canadian. This clause prevents undue financial burdens on future generations for historical occurrences.
- 5 **Cost Responsibility in Divorce:** In divorce cases, the initiating party will be responsible for covering the legal fees and associated costs for both parties, promoting fairness in legal proceedings. Alimony will also be abolished, and any current alimony will be ceased.
- 6 **Child Support and Tax Credits Cap:** Child support and monthly child tax credits will be capped at \$300 per month. Exploitation of children for financial gain will be treated as a punishable offense.
- 7 **Freedom for Off-Grid Electricity:** There will be no restrictions for off-grid electricity generation anywhere in the country, allowing individuals to pursue alternative energy sources without hindrance.
- 8 **National Precious Metals Stockpile:** Canada will establish a national stockpile of precious metals to safeguard against future uncertainties, such as climate change-induced disruptions. These metals will be reserved for ongoing and future projects, including space exploration and humanitarian initiatives.

Crime

From the previous section; if there is more money in the peoples' pockets, crime should lower.

In the meantime, there are things that can be done to plateau the rise. In this section, we will cover a variety of topics. Including, the idea of reclassifying certain offences and harsher sentences for these types of crimes and criminals.

Crime – Auto Crime

This section involves some new ideas to tackle the rising auto crime rate in Canada.

1. **Halt Export of Vehicles:** All vehicles will be prohibited from leaving the country via any means of transportation, including planes, trains, ships, and trailers. This prevents the illicit export of stolen vehicles and disrupts criminal operations.
2. **Collaboration with Railway Police:** Railway Police will collaborate with local law enforcement agencies to investigate crimes involving stolen vehicles. Their assistance and expertise will bolster efforts to apprehend perpetrators and recover stolen property.
3. **Homeowner Defense Rights:** Homeowners will have the right to defend their properties against intruders and thieves. While lethal force is not prohibited, individuals can take necessary actions to apprehend perpetrators. Citizens will not face charges of assault for injuries intruders sustain during a citizen's arrest, provided the force used is proportional and reasonable.
4. **Exploration of Vehicle Encryption:** Exploring encryption technology for automobiles and their key fobs can enhance vehicle security and deter theft. Implementing encryption measures can make it more difficult for criminals to steal vehicles through electronic means, safeguarding against unauthorized access.

Crime – General Policies

These reforms seek to overhaul the judicial system, emphasizing rehabilitation, accountability, and public safety. By addressing systemic flaws and implementing proactive measures, Canada can move towards a more just and equitable society.

- 1. Detention of Repeat Offenders:** Repeat offenders who demonstrate a pattern of criminal behavior and pose a threat to society will not be released. Instead, they will be classified as detainees, losing certain rights until they demonstrate genuine rehabilitation.
- 2. Decriminalization of Drug Possession for Personal Use:** Possession of a 'user amount' of drugs will be decriminalized, with a focus on treating addiction rather than punishment. Confiscated drugs will be destroyed, and individuals will receive support and resources for rehabilitation.
- 3. Ban on Public Financial Gluttony:** Public displays of excessive wealth and financial exploitation will be illegal. Rich individuals advocating for inequality or exploitation will face legal consequences for inciting social discord.
- 4. Mandatory Participation in Government Hearings:** Failure to answer questions at government hearings will be punishable by imprisonment. Avoidance tactics and evasion will be met with severe penalties to ensure transparency and accountability.
- 5. Prison Reform:** New prisons will be constructed with individual cells equipped with essential amenities, including a washroom, shower, bed, and desk. Rehabilitation programs will be enhanced to provide psychological, drug addiction, and family support services.
- 6. Lobbying Ban:** Lobbying by corporations or institutions will be outlawed, and executive members engaging in lobbying activities will face imprisonment. This measure aims to eliminate undue influence on political decision-making and promote transparency in governance.
- 7. Implementation of Military Checkpoints:** In areas plagued by persistent crime, including shootings and drug offenses, military checkpoints will be established in city and at provincial borders. These checkpoints will employ non-invasive search techniques to detect and apprehend individuals involved in criminal activities. These techniques will include the use of X-Ray machines. Police officers will oversee the charging and imprisonment process, ensuring swift and effective law enforcement.

Crime – Crimes Against Humanity

In response to the gravest offenses against humanity, a reimagined law system is proposed to address the most heinous criminals and safeguard the future of the country and its people. The following measures aim to ensure swift and decisive justice for those who threaten the safety and well-being of society.

- 1. Charge of Treason Against the Future:** A new law where, Individuals whose actions cause irreparable harm, death, or corruption of the mind, robbing people of their future, will be charged with treason against the people or treason against the future. They will be classified as terrorists and tried accordingly, facing charges for stealing the future in addition to their original crimes. Detainees will be treated as military detainees and subject to military court proceedings.
- 2. Establishment of Open-Air Military POW Prison:** A specialized military POW prison will be established to house individuals convicted of crimes against humanity and treason against the future. These prisoners will face expedited trials with the death penalty as the sole available punishment. Informants providing accurate information leading to successful arrests will receive a reward, while false allegations will result in their own arrest.
- 3. Canadian Army Intervention against Child Exploitation and Drug Trafficking:** The Canadian Army will be authorized to conduct unilateral raids and detain individuals involved in the creation, distribution, and uploading of child exploitation material and illegal drugs. By targeting the source, the proliferation of harmful materials and substances will be curbed, contributing to the psychological well-being of the country.
- 4. Restriction of VPN Access:** The use of VPNs connecting to countries with a legal age under 16 or countries with divergent internet laws incompatible with Canadian standards will be prohibited. This measure aims to prevent access to harmful content and protect vulnerable individuals from exploitation.
- 5. Detainment for Murder:** Individuals charged of murder will also be detained within the POW prison, recognizing murder as a crime against humanity that deprives victims of their future.
- 6. Detainment for Gun Crimes:** Perpetrators of gun-related crimes, including intimidation and gang affiliations, will be detained within the specialized prison. Their disregard for life and property warrants exclusion from the civilian justice system.
- 7. Criminalization of Financial Exploitation of Children:** Financial exploitation of children will be established as a criminal offense, with offenders detained in the POW prison alongside other perpetrators of grave crimes.
- 8. Implementation of Artificial Intelligence on the Internet:** This will track and report CEMAT.

Education

At all levels of education, we are being indoctrinated into a subject matter. Whether its math, food, construction, mechanics, fitness, or to our own society.

Education – Reform for All Levels

In recognition of the need for a more balanced and practical education system, the following policies aim to overhaul the current structure. These policies prioritize student well-being, practical skill development, and alignment with economic demands, fostering a more efficient and effective education system that better serves the needs of students and society:

- 1. Elimination of Homework:** Homework will be abolished across all levels of education, from JK to universities, including specialized schools. This shift recognizes the importance of rest and reduces the burden on students, promoting overall well-being.
- 2. Integration of Life Skills Classes:** Basic life skills classes will be incorporated into the curriculum for every student. These classes will cover essential skills such as tax filing, vehicle maintenance, cooking, and self-care, ensuring students are equipped for independent living.
- 3. Temporary Halt on Foreign Student Enrollment:** In response to the housing crisis and to prioritize opportunities for Canadian students, enrollment of foreign students will be suspended for a period of ten years. - 4. Regulation of Foreign Students' Financial Proof:** To prevent fraudulent practices, foreign students will be required to demonstrate proof of funds in a Canadian bank account. This measure ensures transparency and accountability in financial representations.
- 5. Elimination of Electives Across All Levels:** Electives will be phased out across all levels of education, aligning coursework with students' chosen fields of study. This measure reduces unnecessary academic requirements and allows students to focus on their areas of interest and career goals.
- 6. Economy-Driven Degree Allocation:** Canadian schools will adjust enrollment quotas for degree programs based on economic demand. This ensures that the number of students enrolled in a particular field aligns with workforce needs, reducing the prevalence of underemployment among degree holders.

- 7 Language Proficiency Requirement for Future Foreign Educators:** Foreign teachers or professors seeking employment in Canadian schools must pass a spoken English accent exam to ensure clear communication with students. This measure prioritizes effective learning by ensuring that all students can easily understand instructional content.
- 8 Mandatory Language Proficiency Test for Current Foreign Educators:** Existing foreign teachers or professors will be required to undergo a spoken English accent exam. Failure to pass the exam will result in removal from their position, with the individual encouraged to pursue alternative career paths if necessary.
- 9 Language Proficiency Exam for Foreign Students:** Foreign students intending to enroll in Canadian schools must also pass a spoken English accent exam. Clear communication is essential in educational settings to prevent misunderstandings and enhance safety, particularly in practical or hands-on learning environments.
- 10 Reform of Public School System:** The traditional model of classroom-based learning for extended hours no longer adequately prepares students for the modern workforce. A reformed public school system will prioritize hands-on and experience-based learning approaches that fosters critical thinking and creativity. New schools will be designed to nurture students' minds and encourage forward-thinking, departing from the traditional lecture-based instruction model.

Military

In this section, policies are outlined to enhance technological advancements and reform military policies for optimal effectiveness and readiness.

Military – General Policies

Outlined below are policies aimed at enhancing military effectiveness, fostering a supportive culture, and driving technological advancement within the armed forces. These policies aim to promote a culture of accountability, inclusivity, and innovation within the armed forces, while also enhancing military capabilities and technological readiness for future challenges:

Benefit specialists will be available to guide members through the process, ensuring a smooth transition to civilian life.
6. **Career Management Autonomy:** All Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) members will have the right to directly communicate with their career managers to manage their own career paths. This initiative aims to empower individuals to take ownership of their professional development and advancement, reducing dependence on chain of command interventions.
7. **Retention Incentives:** Reenlistment and retention bonuses will be introduced to incentivize experienced personnel to remain in the military. These bonuses will recognize the value of skilled and dedicated service members, contributing to overall force readiness and effectiveness.

8. **Oversight Hotline:** A dedicated hotline will be established for CAF personnel to report instances where their chain of command has overstepped boundaries or failed to uphold the values of the Canadian Armed Forces. This confidential hotline will provide a recourse for individuals who feel their concerns are not adequately addressed within the existing command structure, ensuring accountability and adherence to military standards.
9. **Direct Transfer to CBSA:** After completing seven years of military service, personnel will have the option for a direct transfer to the Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA). This initiative aims to facilitate career transitions for individuals seeking opportunities in border security and law enforcement upon leaving the military. By streamlining the transition process, qualified personnel can seamlessly transition to civilian roles while leveraging their military experience and skills.
10. **Limitations of Secret Society Members:** Members of any secret society, ex. Free Masons, will not be allowed to hold a rank above private trained, a 1 hook private. Any serving members that are currently holding positions above this rank will be immediately demoted, as well as their pay decreased to match the rank. This is to ensure that members of secret societies are not in positions of power. Incentives to report these individuals will be established.
11. **Restructuring of the Reserve Force:** Reservists of all elements will no longer be eligible for foreign deployments. This is to ensure that the regular force is a coherent force that is abundant in opportunity. People join the regular due to the 'Wow Factor', and when reservists are taking spots on foreign deployments, the regular force members feel cheated.
 1. Reservists will transition to a focus of working with cadets, cubs, scouts, bold eagle, civilian engagement, etc.
 2. Reservist combat units will operate as an independent unit under the command of an overarching battlegroup commander, battalion commander, etcetera. There are many cases where reservists are training with regular force member and they are inadequately trained, resulting in the members injury.

12. Air Force Training Expansion: The Air Force will deploy on field training exercises and train in austere environments for up to 6 months. This will harden the Air Force to an acceptable level of soldiery and provide commanders and senior NCOs with the ability to actually lead and develop survival skills. Entire Air Force bases will deploy at once. This is to include;

1. The use of austere runways for all levels of pilots, and also living in a tent.
2. Information Technology Technicians of all levels will deploy, including those who simply diagnose, and repair computers will also deploy to austere environments.
3. The Air Force will be issued the standard army kit of a rifle, ruck sack, gas mask, etc.
4. Communication Centers will be developed to deploy to austere environments.
5. Command Centers holding intelligence and high-ranking officers will be developed to deploy to austere environments.

13. Compensation for Military Personnel Discharged Due to COVID-19 Vaccination Stance: Members wrongfully released from the military due to their stance on COVID-19 vaccinations will be compensated for the unjust termination to their careers resulting from vaccination policies. These members will also have their benefits reinstated for immediate access to any and all VAC benefits that they are entitled to.

14. Individual Rights Regarding Vaccination: Every Canadian citizen has the right to choose whether or not to be vaccinated against a particular virus or disease. While vaccination policies may exist, individuals should not face discrimination for their personal choices. Those who opt not to be vaccinated may be excluded from foreign deployments but will always be allowed to continue to fulfill domestic employment duties and responsibilities, thus their lives and families are not affected.

Military – Development of the Future

To propel our military to the forefront of technological innovation, the following initiatives will be undertaken. These initiatives aim to position our military as a leader in cutting-edge technology, ensuring readiness, effectiveness, and superiority in modern warfare scenarios. These are the things we would like to do with the increase in military spending.

Housing – Landlords

Habitual greed in the housing industry will be a thing of the past. Houses are a necessity of life; accommodations especially rent, should be affordable. These policies will not affect those landlords that rent 1-10 single family homes or apartments. The aim of these policies are not to deter everyday Canadians, from investing in property or owning rental properties.

These policies will be implemented in order to regulate those that own multiple properties and take advantage of tenants.

1. **Rental Management Company Requirement for Large Landlords:**

- a) Landlords owning eleven (11) or more apartments or houses must establish a rental management company. In high-rise or apartment buildings, this number is counted by the number of units in the building.
- b) The owner, board of directors, and officers of the rental management company will have their salary capped at \$300,000.
- c) The annual profit of rental management companies will be capped at \$1 million. If this cap is reached before the years end, the company must operate at a net zero profit and lower the cost of rent for tenants.

2. **Restriction on Foreign Ownership:**

- a) No foreign entities will be allowed to own Canadian houses or apartment buildings.
- b) Foreign entities currently owning properties in the Canadian housing market will be required to divest their holdings.
- c) Failure to comply will result in the seizure and forfeiture of their holdings to Canadian entities for sale on the market.

Housing – Development of the Future

To address the housing shortage and stimulate economic growth, we propose a bold plan to revitalize ghost towns and build new cities. By implementing these policies, we aim to not only address the housing shortage but also create new job opportunities, foster economic growth, and revitalize communities across the country.

As stated in the fundamental maximums page, building new cities will allow these big companies to continue growth and thus hiring more employees.

1. **Formation of National Construction Company:**
 - a) Establish a national construction company tasked with designing, organizing, building, and maintaining new towns and cities.
